

Mary M. Horowitz, MD, MS Robert A. Uihlein, Jr. Chair in Hematologic Research Professor of Medicine

Dr. Mary Horowitz currently holds the Robert A. Uihlein, Jr. Chair in Hematologic Research and is a tenured Professor of Medicine and Chief of the Division of Hematology and Oncology at the Medical College of Wisconsin (MCW), where she is also an active blood and marrow transplant physician. She is also Chief Scientific Director of the Center for International Blood and Marrow Transplant Research. She received MCW's Distinguished Service

Award in June 2006, MCW's highest honor. In 2010, Dr. Horowitz received the American Society of Hematology Mentor Award. The award recognizes scientists who have dedicated their life to the process of guiding, supporting and promoting the training and career development of their junior colleagues. In 2014, Dr. Horowitz received the American Society of Blood and Marrow Transplant's Lifetime Achievement Award in recognition of her contributions to the advancement of transplantation as a therapy for life-threatening diseases.

Her clinical and research activities focus on the care and outcome of persons receiving blood and marrow transplants and in evaluating the role of transplantation in malignant and non-malignant diseases. I am particularly interested in understanding, treating and preventing long term complications of Transplantation such as chronic GVHD (graft versus host disease).
